

Survey of WFCC culture collections



The contribution of public networks to knowledge accumulation: Ex situ collections in microbial research: Per M. Stromberg, Tom Dedeurwaerdere, Unai Pascual (2010)

- 103 collections responded
- 15% of their holdings were Type strains
- 23% recipients in industry; 60% in academia or hospitals
- 67% charge supply fee
- Funding: 15% receive no public funding; 11% receive 1-40% funding; 8% receive 41-60%; 13% are 61-80% funded; 54% receive more than 80% public funding
- Holdings sourced from other collections: between 1-17%
- 38% received with some sort of MTA
- 82% of the collections were in OECD countries
- 10% in USA

Does the WFCC deliver all that is needed: Lessons learned



- Relies on individual voluntary input
- Needs
 - Permanent employed staff
 - Mandate to implement common standards and procedures
 - Strong Governance
 - Manageable agreed action plan
 - Adequate funding
 - Strong linkage to users and policy makers
 - A strategy to encourage deposits
 - Co-ordination of tasks





- Develop a GBRCN information system a "system of systems". Building on what is already there and accommodates that which is yet to come; adaptable, inclusive and accessible
- The GBRCN has to play a role in the access and benefit sharing arrangement ensuring traceability and accountability
- Management of brokering value
- Get the messaging right about why countries and culture collections should join the GBRCN
